

DAY 1





MARRAKECH

Arrival at Marrakech airport.
Reception and assistance.
Transfer to the hotel.
Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 2





MARRAKECH

After breakfast, meet at 8:00 AM for a city tour:

Majorelle Garden, the botanical garden of French painter Jacques Majorelle. Bahia Palace, a masterpiece of Moroccan architecture with its gardens and courtyards.

Stop in front of the Koutoubia Mosque, an emblematic monument of Almohad art.

Lunch at the hotel.

Walk through Jemaa El Fna Square, the most famous square in Marrakech, listed as an UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage site. It is an enchanting open-air theater.

Visit to the souks.

Dinner at leisure and overnight at the hotel.







MARRAKECH - ESSAOUIRA

After breakfast, departure for Essaouira, formerly known as "Mogador."

Visit of Essaouira, a coastal city with an 18th-century medina protected by ramparts called Skala de la Kasbah, designed by European engineers.

The fortifications, adorned with old brass cannons, offer a breathtaking view of the ocean.

Essaouira's beaches, known for their strong trade winds, are perfect for surfing, windsurfing, and kitesurfing.

Lunch at leisure in the medina

After the visit, return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.





AGADIR



ESSAOUIRA - AGADIR

After breakfast, departure along the coastal road towards Agadir, Morocco's largest seaside resort.

On the way, enjoy picturesque views of the "flying goats" perched on argan trees.

From the top of Agadir's hill, admire the ruins of the Kasbah and a panoramic view of the city and its endless sandy beach.

Visit the Kasbah ruins, remnants of the devastating earthquake of the last century.

Lunch.

Free time for relaxation or personal exploration. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.





DAY 5





AGADIR – TAROUDANT - OUARZAZATE


After breakfast, departure for Ouarzazate, passing through Taroudant, often called the "Little Marrakech".

Located in the Souss Valley, surrounded by the vast Atlas Mountains, Taroudant is a hidden gem with a unique natural setting, granite rock formations, and historical monuments.

Lunch at leisure, then continuation to Ouarzazate.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 6





ERFOUD

OUARZAZATE - TODRA GORGES - MERZOUGA - ERFOUD

Departure towards the Tinghir plateau, following the Dades Valley via Skoura and El Kelaa, known as the City of Roses.

Discover the Jorf Palm Grove, then visit the Todra Gorges, with cliffs over 300 meters high.

Lunch with locals.

Continue to Erfoud.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Optional excursions (extra charge): 4x4 sunset excursion in Merzouga dunes Overnight in a luxury desert camp in Merzouga (includes dinner, accommodation in fully equipped tents with beds, blankets, showers, and shared toilets).





ERFOUD - IFRANE - FEZ

7:30 AM departure to Fès, passing through the Ziz Gorges, the Hassan Addakhil Dam, and its lake.

Lunch at leisure in Midelt.

Stop in Azrou, in the Cedar Forest, home to wild Atlas monkeys.

Continue to Ifrane, a charming alpine-style town known for its cedar forests and winter sports.

Arrive in Fès.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 8

FEZ

After breakfast, 9:00 AM, visit of Morocco's spiritual capital:

Attarine Madrasa, an ancient Koranic school built in 1325.

Nejjarine Square with its magnificent fountain. Karaouine Mosque (exterior view), the world's first university.

Explore the souks and visit the tanners' quarter. Lunch at leisure.

Continue to Fès El Jedid, its walls, Royal Palace. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

























Early breakfast and departure to Meknès, founded as a rural village in the 8th century. Visit Bab Mansour Gate and Moulay Ismail Mosque.

Lunch, then depart for Chefchaouen via Zgota and Ouazzane.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.



Breakfast and city tour of Chefchaouen, known for its bluewashed houses and vibrant souks.

Visit the Kasbah, a 15th-century fortress with ethnographic and art exhibitions.

Departure for Rabat, Morocco's capital:

Hassan Tower, Mausoleum of Mohammed V, and Mechouar Royal Palace.

Oudayas Kasbah and Medina.

Lunch, then continue to Casablanca, the country's economic hub.

Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DEPARTUE

Breakfast and a panoramic tour of Casablanca: Corniche, Mohamed V Square. Transfer to the airport according to flight schedules.
